- After being the finance director of the Wishek Living Center facility since 2009, Tonya Schnabel was recently licensed and promoted to administrator, replacing interim administrator Mike Hall. Hall replaced Kelly VanderVorste who took a job closer to home in Mandan. VanderVorste had succeeded longtime administrator Greg Salwei.
- The Wishek Public Library Board of Directors (the "Board") and Wishek Public School ("WPS") were seeking a part time librarian for the Wishek Public Library; the Board is seeking an individual to cover the hours on Wednesday and Sunday, and WPS was seeking an individual to cover 15 hours per week during regular school hours.
- The ND Legislature approved SB 2183 to help relieve the cost burden of counties, cities and townships for snow removal this winter.
- McIntosh County celebrated National County Government Month (NCGM) April 10-14 to showcase how the county achieves healthy, safe and vibrant communities. The employees invite the public to take a self-guided tour of the courthouse and ask questions to learn about each office.
- The Wishek City Council held their community donut feed on April 28th at the Civic Center.
- South Central Health, a Critical Access Hospital (CAH) in Wishek, was named as one of the Top 100 CAHs in the country for 2023, according to the Chartis Center for Rural Health. Top 100 hospitals are top performers, excelling in financial efficiency, achieving higher quality, securing better outcomes,

increasing patient satisfaction, and operating at a lower cost than their peers.

- Staffing concerns were the top priority of the Wishek School board at their April monthly meeting. They were looking to fill positions for a music teacher, a special ed teacher, and four paraprofessionals.
- Incumbents Lila Raile (1978) and Marla Berntson and newcomer Don Hochhalter (1976) were named to the South Central Health board of directors. The election was held during South Central Health's annual meeting in May.

The money will be used to buy three bowling ball ramps and additional smaller bowling balls for children to use. Bell Bank of Fargo also donated \$1,000. This donation will help to maintain this recreation facility.

- Valedictorian for the 10-member class of 2023 in Wishek was Charles Herr. Camryn Soelberg-Dohn was named the salutatorian.
- Unison Bank and McIntosh County Bank teamed up to show their support for the McIntosh County Sheriff's Department by helping raise funds for a drug detection dog. The two financial institutions donated a total of \$2,500 towards their fundraising effort.
- Incumbent Wishek School Board President Curt Meidinger retained his seat by winning 21 of 22 votes in the June election.
- This Tri-County Tourism Alliance historic preservation project called "Women Behind the Plow" premiered at the 2015 Wishek Sauerkraut Day and has since traveled the state and into South Dakota. It was on exhibit in the hallway between the Wishek Clinic and the Wishek Hospital from June until August 1.

- Wishek's Quasquicentennial was held June 29-July 2.
- The 97th Tri-County Fair was held Thursday through Sunday, July 13-16.

- The 98th Annual Wishek Sauerkraut Day was held October 11th at the civic center. A vendor show was also held at the National Guard Armory.
- Wishek Wildlife held their 52nd Annual Buffalo Supper on October 20th at the Wishek Civic Center.
- The Wishek Association of Commerce sponsored "Trunk or Treat" on October 31st in the civic center.
- The South Border Mustangs were defeated by the North Prairie Cougars in the Class B 9-man football championship game in the Dakota Bowl at the Fargodome on November 10th. The final score was 16-8.
- Wishek's famous sausage from Stan's Supermarket was a hit at the Pride of Dakota Holiday Showcase on December 1-2 in Bismarck.
- The Wishek Association of Commerce sponsored Santa Claus Day on Sunday, December 10th, at the Wishek school.
- Tabitha Kinzler from Kulm completed her training at the North Dakota Police Academy and will be a new police officer in Wishek joining Chief Andy Tunheim.
- The Wishek Senior Center received a \$430 gift from the North Dakota Community Foundation to help with cleaning of carpets. The North Dakota Community Foundation was formed to create an easy way for North Dakotans to help their neighbors and friends through charitable giving.

Wishek Swimming Pool Renovation Project

Michael Martell (1978) is president of the Wishek park board and chairman of the pool renovation committee. His goal is giving the pool, built in 1942, a much-needed facelift. Improvements planned are updated filtration and heating systems, a new chemical dispensing configuration, installation of modern gutters, and a more efficient pool pump. The bathhouse is registered with the North Dakota Historical

Society, so major exterior cosmetic changes are not allowed. The inside of the bathhouse will see remodeling, such as fresh coats of paint. The old kiddie pool will be converted into a 'zero-entrance' into the pool. A splash pad complete with slides, fountains, and spray toys will be installed on the northeast side. The Renovation Brick Fundraiser features customizable namesake bricks that will form the walkway to the

entrance of the pool. Starting at \$150, those who contribute may inscribe their name or message into a brick. Businesses also have the option to place their logo on single bricks or brick arrays. A variety of sizes are available for purchase. The fundraiser's goal is \$950,000. Monetary donations are also accepted. Construction is tentatively set to begin after the 2024 regular pool season.
